MT. LEBANON CHURCH STARTED IN 1774 ACTIVE IN 1981

A picturesque, small stone building, painted white, beside a woods, has nurtured a devout congregation of Methodists for one hundred and forty-seven years. But a group of worshippers existed here for sixty years before that. The Mt. Lebanon United Methodist Church, at the corner of Mt. Lebanon and Sharpley Roads, off Concord Pike, has a long history of struggle and survival. The Mt. Lebanon Road, which plunges down a steep hill into Rockland Road and the Brandywine Creek, took its name from this old church which was a landmark back in the mid 1800's.

The origins of the congregation of this little church go way back in time, long before its building of 1834. There was circuit rider out of Chester, Pennsylvania in 1774 who came to preach periodically to a group of about thirty-six Methodists on record in this area. They met in private homes and sometimes in schoolhouses, as their numbers increased. Still a united group by 1812, their first minister was the Reverend Richard Sneath.

In about 1824, Brother Thomas J. Aldred and wife gave a piece of their farmland, 165 perches, on which to build a church. Ten years later the quaint stone building was erected. Some familiar Brandywine Hundred names appear on the first list of the Board of Trustees, dated 1833: Curtis and Charles Talley, John Frame, V. Thomas Underwood and Casper Mundew. Reverend John Talley, active during the earliest days of this church, was buried in 1861 in the Mt. Lebanon Cemetery adjoining the church. The enclosed graveyard contains the graves of six Civil War Veterans and one from the Spanish American War. Their graves are adorned with flags on Memorial Day. The oldest existing legible gravestone is that of Ezra Evans who died in 1836. Many of the early graves of the 1840's were of young babies--a sad reflection on early medicine.

The Talley family of more recent times replaced, in 1974, the ancient tombstone of the Reverend John Talley with a new stone mentioning all three of his wives: Letitia Clark, Ann Henderson and Ann Hollingsworth. Mary and Adolphus Husbands are the earliest couple to be buried in the cemetery--in 1844 and 1846 respectively. Many of their descendants still reside in the area.

The original burial records were burned by an angry sexton in the 1920's, disgruntled because he did not get a raise. The records of the Newark Union Cemetery and Chester-Bethel were lost in the same way. The Delaware Genealogical Society has recently completed their sand and cornstarch rubbings of the old stones and their

recordings of the older section of the graveyard have been deposited at the Historical Society of Delaware's library.

This little church has had its ups and downs for over two centuries, sometimes languishing, sometimes bursting at the seams. Between 1940 and 1952, money was raised for a new addition. Built almost entirely by volunteer labor, it is called "The John Banbury Building", named for the contractor who made it all possible. Joined to the original 1834 structure by a passageway, it blends well with the older building, both outside and in.

Over the years, Mt. Lebanon has had student and lay preachers or its own full time minister. In recent years it has shared ministers with the Siloam Church, or with Aldersgate or with Hockessin. At the present time it is associated with Mt. Salem Church at Rockford Park. Its present congregation is a little over two hundred.

MOUNT LEBANON CEMETERY

New Castle County, Delaware

The Mount Lebanon Cemetery is located between Mt. Lebanon Road and Sharpley Road near Talleyville, Delaware. It is next to the Mount Lebanon United Methodist Church.

Members of the Cemetery Committee of the Delaware Genealogical Society read the stones in the old section of the cemetery in July 1979 and finished the project in April 1980.

The coordinates in the right hand column of the listing represent approximate distances in feet from the Northwest corner of cemetery. The single numbers are plot numbers on a cemetery map, a copy of which is in possession of the committee chairman.

The burial records, 1713-65, and the communicant records, 1713-56, Holy Trinity (Old Swedes) Church, were printed in *Delaware History* in Volumes V, VI and VII, 1963, 1964 and 1965. According to Mr. Baldwin Maull, who requested that these baptismal records be printed, a change of editorial policy prevented the conclusion of the series in *Delaware History*. However, it will greatly enhance the value of this portion to refer to the previously published articles, since they are copiously footnoted. Unfortunately, Mrs. Skinner is not here to embellish this material.

In the introduction to the aforementioned publications, explanation is made as to the difficulties in reporting names. The critical statements for present purposes, may be these: "... names are spelled exactly as they appear in the manuscript, with the addition, in brackets, of letters needed to complete an abbreviated form. Where either given name or surname was omitted by the original writer, it has been supplied, if possible, from the other records; where names or parts of names have disappeared, because the center of the page has crumbled, these too, have been filled in from the same sources. Names which would not readily suggest their present-day counterparts, as "Ersson" (Erickson), have been identified. In all cases, such added letters or names have been enclosed in brackets."

These records, being very early, and of a scope wider than the immediate parish, are invaluable resources. We are most grateful to Mr. Maull for bringing them to our attention.

CHURCH OF ENGLAND PARISHIONERS SUSSEX COUNTY, DELAWARE, 1732

Excerpt from the Journal of the Rev. William Becket, Missionary of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, Church of England, to Sussex Co., Province of Pennsylvania.¹

Sussex Co.

We whose names are hereunto subscribed do promise to pay or cause to be paid to Wm. Becket, Missionary at Lewes, or order the several sums annexed to our respective names in money or county produce within the space of 12 months from the date hereof in order to enable him to buy the Plantation of Mr. Samuel Davis in Angola Neck for his better settlement and support among us, witness our hands this 25th Day of March 1732.

Note if the s.^d William Becket shall hereafter leave this county, and accept another Parish, he doth oblige himself thereby to repay to the Ch. Wardens the sums which the people respectively advance towards supporting the next minister of the Ch. of England which shall be his Successor in the s.^d County.

This list was compiled, beginning with a card file prepared by various local DAR members, from the Annual Reports of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution (reprinted with permission). It does not include all the information presented in those reports, but it serves as a starting point.

Each entry was checked against the *DAR Patriot Index*, Volumes I and II, and information added from them. Some, where questions arose, were checked against the *Tatnall Tombstone Index*, prepared by the WPA, at the Hall of Records in Dover, and discrepancies noted.

Despite all this, it is neither purported to be complete, nor entirely correct, but should still be a useful tool. Additions and corrections with verifications, will be warmly welcomed, and published in a future edition.
