PIGEON RUN PRESBYTERIAN CEMETERY

Pigeon Run Cemetery, located near Red Lion, in New Castle Hundred, Delaware, has stones dating from the mid 1700's. In the past few years, through the efforts of the Cemetery Committee of the Delaware Genealogical Society, a Boy Scout Troop working under the auspices of the New Castle Presbytery, and through the good services of adjoining neighbors, the cemetery has been reclaimed from dense over growth and bramble.

There are two very old table stones, set on bricks; one belonging to the Reverend Samuel Eakin (1745-1783) is clearly readable and tells a story of the area; the other, said to be that of Catherine Bryan and probably her husband John, is overturned and still a mystery.

The following list has been compiled from several sources besides the recent reading of the remaining stones. We have used the Walter G. Tatnall Tombstone Records (copied from the stones by the WPA), a short column of "Burials in Pigeon Run Cemetery" on page 55 of *A History of Pencader Presbyterian Church* of Glasgow, Delaware by the Reverend Henry G. Welbon, September 1936.

A DELAWARE BIBLE RECORD

This material was copied, in August 1970, by Mrs. Thelma Hansford, Genealogical Records Chairman of Comte de Grasse Chapter NSDAR, Yorktown, Virginia, from a Bible found in an attic of a home there. The present location of the Bible is unknown. The copy was presented by Society member Lois Clowes Witherspoon (Mrs. James C.) of Topeka, Kansas, with additional information (given below) identifying the Clowes data as relating to a Delaware family.

Woman Patience was taken with the Colery at 7 o'clock in the morning after she had cleared off breakfast and died at 9 o'clock in the morning and buried 1/2 past 9 next morning Friday 10th. 50 new cases yesterday and how many died unknown—an awful time this."

From Mrs. Witherspoon:

"Isaac Clowes birth 20 August 1772 to John Clowes, Jr. and his wife, Mary, is documented in *Some Records of Sussex County, Delaware*, By C. H. B. Turner, page 346. His marriage to Hannah Conwell ("John Hazzard's first wife's daughter") is documented in the same publication on page 367. Prior to locating this Bible record, I was unable to find a record of the children of Isaac Clowes and Hannah Conwell Clowes. Since locating this bible, I have located some more substantiating information in the Clowes Family Notes filed with the Genealogical Society of Pennsylvania, Hall of the Historical Society, 1300 Locust Street, Philadelphia, Pa. 19107. This material is found in the Herbert N. Bayne Collection and in the Justice Collection, both referring to the Clowes family of Jamaica, Long Island, N.Y. to which the Sussex County, De. family was related. Following is a quotation from page 9 of those papers:

m. December 19, 1792, at presbyterian Church, Lewes,

BLACK BIRTH RECORDS, NEW CASTLE COUNTY, DELAWARE, 1810—1853

by Mary Fallon Richards

An Act defining the status of slaves manumitted to be free at some future date as passed by the Delaware General Assembly in February 1810. It included a stipulation that "every person being an inhabitant of the State, who shall be entitled to the services of any child born to any negro manumitted as aforesaid, or of the issue of such manumitted negro as aforesaid, shall within twelve months after the birt. of such child, cause to be delivered to the recorder of the county whereof such person shall be inhabitant, a certificate in writing, containing the name, age and sex of the child born, . . . and such record . . . be deemed and taken as evidence of the age of such child." Determination of age was important because of a further stipulation of the same Act, which provided that such children should become free, the males at the age of 25 and the females at the age of 21¹. The record book for New Castle County is preserved at the Hall of Records in Dover². Because surnames were not yet adopted by all of these persons, the records are arranged below in alphabetical order by the name of the master or mistress. The abbreviation "mm" is used for "manumitted."

SOME REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS AND THEIR HEIRS*

by William H. Dumont

"In a volume entitled 'Bounty Land Scrip—Act of 1833', now part of the old loan records of the Treasury Department in the National Archives, Washington, D. C., are many names of Revolutionary soldiers and their heirs who were issued bounty land scrip in place of the military bounty land warrants given for service during the Revolution. This volume has the call number 'NN' and that of the index of soldiers' names in it is 'NN-1'. The entries start 18 April 1833 and stop 19 Jan. 1870.

"Bounty land scrip was authorized by Congress 30 May 1830. The title of the Act stated: 'For the relief of certain officers and soldiers of the Virginia Line and Navy, and of the Continental Army, during the Revolutionary War', and authorized the veterans to surrender to the Secretary of the Treasury before 1 Jan. 1835 unsatisfied military bounty land warrants, and receive in their place certificates or scrip which could be used at any land office in Indiana, Illinois and Ohio. A total of 50,000 acres was allotted for those in the Continental Line. As scrip for all of this had been issued by the early part of 1832, Congress authorized an additional (p. 178) 300,000 acres on 13 July 1832 and another 200,000 acres on 2 March 1833 . . .

"Only those veterans whose heirs received scrip or were still alive at the date of the transfer of the warrants to scrip are included in the list. Omitted are the names of those who had assigned their warrants to others at some earlier date.

"This is a list of the heirs of some veterans of the Revolutionary War, made fifty or more years after the signing of the Treaty of Ghent which officially confirmed the breaking away of the thirteen colonies from England . . ."
