## CHESTER BETHEL CEMETERY

Foulk Road, Brandywine Hundred  
New Castle County, Delaware

The Delaware Genealogical Society's Cemetery Committee, with the cooperation of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Emsley, keepers of the Chester Bethel cemetery records, started reading the old section of the cemetery in the spring of 1981. With many return trips to check and re-check the worn stones, we kept waiting to publish until we were sure we had the most correct information possible. An old plot map was very helpful, but the actual alignment of the graves did not match it too closely, making identification for our readers difficult.

To help in this respect, we have assigned the letters A, B, C, and D to the four areas of the oldest section. "A" section is the first row from Foulk Road. These letters, with numbers, are to help the reader group the families together. A good example is the Clayton family in D120 and D48, besides D92 and D104½--the Claytons can tell which names are buried together by comparing their numbers. When the lists reach the Talleys and Zeblys, this system should be especially valuable.

The Emsley's records are complete after 1934. In 1983 a listing of the cemetery, by a group of people from Chester, Pa. about 1950, was discovered by the chairman of our committee. It was on a microfilm among Delaware County, Pa. cemeteries and listed as such. This list has proved very helpful to us. Several stones that we had been struggling to decipher correctly must have been much easier to read in 1950 and several stones that have now disappeared were noted.

Independently, the Emsley's also learned of this cemetery record at about the same time and were given a manuscript copy which they have shared with us. We have found that we have additions and corrections which make our readings worthwhile. We present in the *Journal* our readings of the old section. For listings after 1900, please contact the Emsleys through the church office.

## HALL OF FAME DELAWARE GENEALOGISTS

In frank imitation of the National Genealogical Society, the Journal is hereby instituting its own Hall of Fame for Delaware genealogists. Like them, we will include only those who have died. The NGS is choosing only one nominee per year, and our candidates might be somewhat delayed in their recognition at that rate. Therefore, we decided to hasten the process by featuring a few of the most honored, beginning with this issue.

In the meantime, we would appreciate any input from the members who know of former Delaware genealogists and their work, biographies, etc., who would like to share their information with us.

The choice is not easy, but chronologically it seems that the Reverend C. H. B. Turner was a star in the annals of early work in Delaware.

### THE REV. CHARLES HENRY BLACK TURNER, D. D.

Dr. C. H. B. Turner's claim to fame rests not merely on his genealogical contributions, though they were great, and of most interest to us. He was a priest of the Episcopal Church, and served widely, in Florida, Colorado, Texas, Alabama and Tennessee, before coming to Delaware. Here he was twice rector at St. Peter's, Lewes, for a total of 18 years, 1901-1913, 1917-1924, having obtained his doctorate in the interim. He held various Diocesan offices, and performed notable work as chaplain at the Lewes Naval Air Base during World War I.

Dr. Turner was an historian, instrumental in marking the site of the first settlement in Delaware. For this work, he was honored by the Dutch government in 1909, in commemorization of the anniversary of the entrance of Henry Hudson, then in the Dutch employ, into the Delaware Bay off Lewes. He was presented with a letter, a picture of Queen Wilhelmina, and a large carved replica of the arms of Hoorn, the Dutch city for which Lewes was originally named. These, along with a portrait of Dr. Turner, are still preserved in Lewes.

Born in New Castle, Charles Henry Black Turner carried a truly native heritage. He was descended from the first Provincial Dutch Governor, Peter Jacquet. His mother was Harriet Caulk. He was an ardent genealogist, compiling data on large numbers of his Sussex Co. neighbors, much of it preserved in nine large volumes of notes to be found at the Historical Society of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia. (An attempt is being made to procure copies, in some form, to be deposited in Delaware for the convenience of researchers here.)

In addition to his manuscript notes, Dr. Turner published two books of genealogical merit. They were Rodney's Diary and Other Delaware Records and Some Records of Sussex County. Though they have had some critics, they contain much valuable information, preserved for our use by one of the pioneers in Delaware genealogy.

Dr. Turner died in Florida, 9 October 1930.

## WILMINGTON BOARDING SCHOOL FOR GIRLS

Circular of the Institution and Catalogue of Teachers and Pupils

Wilmington, Del., 1845

Discovered\* and edited by Mary Fallon Richards

\* At the Wilmington Institute Central Library. This old book, call number D 373.751, W69, was printed in Philadelphia by Merrihew & Thompson, Printers, of No. 7 Carter's Alley. There is a companion volume, outlining the curriculum and activities. This one is of interest primarily because it gives the names and places of residence of a number of young ladies who are not likely to be named in most of the extant records of the period. It also names their teachers, and contains a brief description of the school, its courses of study, fees, etc., including the following:

"The location...is in a retired and elevated part of Wilmington, uniting the advantages of a country and a city residence..." Apparently, from the address given the principal in the Directory for 1845, they are referring to the corner of King and Tenth! Surprising to think of that now so central location as "retired and elevated."

"The terms for Boarding, Lodging, Washing, and Tuition..., are One Hundred and Forty-five Dollars per annum." (Day scholars, forty.) "...Pupils may remain as Boarders during either vacation, at a charge of Two Dollars per week. The Scholars attend the meetings of the Society of Friends."

#### RICHARD ALLEN FIND

A discovery among the Chew papers at the Historical Society of Pennsylvania adds a surprising fact to the story of the Rev. Richard Allen (1760-1831). He was a slave in Delaware who later became a distinguished Methodist preacher and the founder, in Philadelphia, of the AME church. When he was a child his family had been sold by Benjamin Chew, ostensibly to a Mr. Stokely of Kent Co. near Dover. A deed of manumission and a note which apparently permitted safe passage for a former slave provide evidence that his owner had been, not the Mr. Stokely to whom Allen's own and other writings refer, but a Mr. Stokeley Sturgis! Though the deed of manumission itself, dated 5 Jan 1780, does not name him other than Richard, a later document reads: "This is to certify that the Bearer Richard Allen a Free Negro Man intends to travel some wayes abroad, from this place to work where it suits him, he has behaved himself soberly and honestly when he wrought about this place. Dated this 27th August 1783 Little Creek Hundred County of Kent on Delaware Given under my Hand and Seale. Stokeley Sturgis (Seal) --Richard Allen the barer of above mentioned was born the 14th February 1760 at two o'clock in the morning." --Mary Fallon Richards

## A DELAWARE BIBLE RECORD

### PAYNTER - McCALLA FAMILY BIBLE

Although there is no printed date in the Bible belonging to member Katherine Thompson, it was published and sold by Kember and Sharpless at their bookstore, No. 8 South 4th Street, Philadelphia. As the Bible was given to its original owner in 1833, it can be assumed it was published very soon before that year.

## Supplementary Information Regarding the Bible of William Paynter and the Entries on Its "Family Record" Pages that Relate to the State of Delaware.

The printed (typeset) label pasted on the inside of the front cover reads, "WILLIAM PAYNTER His Bible, Presented to him by his Mother, Elizabeth Paynter, May 21st, 1833." William Paynter wrote his name on the book's first blank page, and the entries regarding his marriage, the births of his parents, and the birth and death of George R. Paynter, presumably his son, appear to be in the same hand.

Elizabeth Paynter (1774-1857) was the daughter of Ann White (1741-1815) and Robert White (1745-1789). She and her parents are buried (gravestones existing) on a farm located on the road running between Lewes and Georgetown, Delaware. She was first married to Capt. Nathaniel Milby late in the year 1793. He was master of a coasting vessel. He died of yellow fever and is buried at Portsmouth, Virginia. Their daughter, Ann Milby, died in 1825 at the age of 26. She is buried near her mother and White grandparents. Their daughter, Hester Milby, married in 1816 John Ponder (1791-1863) who was engaged in general merchandising and the buying and shipping of Sussex County bog iron ore. James Ponder (1819- ? ), their son, was born in Milton, Delaware, and became the 25th Governor of Delaware, 1871-1875. He was again inaugurated as governor in January, 1897. Anna Milby Ponder, daughter of John and Hester (Milby) Ponder, became the wife of Willard Saulsbury (1820- ? ). He was born in Mispillion Hundred, Kent Co., and became Chancellor of the State of Delaware and also a United States Senator. Their son, Willard Saulsbury (1861-1927) was also a United States Senator from Delaware, elected in 1913 for a term ending 1919.

Elizabeth (White) Milby's second husband was Cornelius Paynter (1762-1846) whom she married in 1800. His first wife, Ruth Craig, died in 1799. Cornelius Paynter was a son of Elizabeth (Stockley) and Samuel Paynter (1736-1814), a Sussex County farmer and merchant, also a member of the General Assembly, an associate judge, and a colonel of the militia. His grandfather, Samuel Paynter (1699-1767), was a carpenter, thought to have been the builder in about 1739 of the Maull House, now the DAR Chapter House in Lewes, Delaware. In 1830 Cornelius Paynter was Clerk of the Registers of the Orphans' Court of Sussex County. His name appears on the 1833 list of Georgetown taxables. He may also have been, at one time, the proprietor of the Red Mill. His brother, Samuel Paynter (1768-1845), was born at Paynter's Drawbridge, near Lewes, and he later held various local offices in addition to his business interests and became Delaware's 12th governor, serving 1824-1827. Cornelius Paynter, his brother Samuel, their parents and Paynter grandparents are buried in St. Peter's churchyard in Lewes. Cornelius Paynter was a St. Peter's vestryman.

Cornelius and Elizabeth (White) Paynter had eight children, but only four of them, Ruth W., William, Clifford R., and Mary Ann S., are listed on the "Family Record" page of births. Their daughter, Ruth White Paynter (1805-1875) married in 1832 in Georgetown, James Sherron McCalla (1809-1886). He was born in Salem, New Jersey, but may have been in the printing business about 1830 in Delaware City, Delaware. His name appears on the 1833 tax list for Georgetown Hundred, and he was probably the printer of the presentation label on the Bible. James S. McCalla was almost surely the "editor and proprietor" of *The Republican and Peninsula Advertiser*, the pioneer newspaper in Georgetown, first published in 1835, but named as William S. McCalla on p. 461, Vol. 1, of Scharf's *History of Delaware, 1609-1888*. James S. McCalla moved on to Philadelphia at least as early as 1837, the year his son, Clifford Paynter McCalla, who was later a Philadelphia lawyer, was born there. At one time James S. McCalla was one of the oldest employing printers and successful newspaper publishers in the State of Pennsylvania, one of his publications being the *Episcopal Recorder*.

The Bible's hand-made cloth cover with cross-stitched embroidery, initialed E.E.M., must have been the work of Elizabeth Eunice McCalla (1840-1928), but when it was done would be hard to determine, as her initials were the same after her marriage in 1870 as before. Her husband, George McCauley, "disappeared," after which she lived with her brother Clifford Paynter McCalla and later with his daughter, her niece, May McCalla Foster. May McCalla was married 30 April 1889 at her family's home in Wallingford, Pennsylvania, to Asa Foster. Officiating was "her friend and her husband's old pastor," the Rt. Rev. Leighton Coleman who had become Delaware's second Protestant Episcopal Bishop the preceding year.

It would seem that the Bible, on its journey from Lewes, Delaware, to Wilmington, Delaware, via Philadelphia, passed through the following hands after William Paynter's death in 1841: those of his mother, Elizabeth (White)(Milby) Paynter (1774-1857), the original giver; her daughter Ruth White (Paynter) McCalla (1805-1875); her son, Clifford Paynter McCalla (1837-1892); his sister, Elizabeth Eunice (McCalla) McCauley (1840-1928); her niece, May (McCalla) Foster (1863-1935); her son, Thomas Lansford Foster (1894-1956); to his daughter, Katharine (Foster) Thompson, the Bible's present trustee.

### A QUESTION AS TO DATES

Member Miss R. Maude Bradley of Glenside, PA, kindly brought to our attention a discrepancy in the lead article of Vol. 3, No. 2, page 30. From the Schepn Register, Dick Shute had copied three dates as 1665. It appears that they should have been 1656, from the evidence that Andres Hudde died in 1663 and that the next date, January 1656/7, in the Old Style would have followed December 1656. We cannot believe that Dick copied them wrong. In fact, judging by the care with which he prepared all his work, and the fact that the three were identical, it seems more likely that the transposition had been made by a previous copier. As we do not have access to the originals, we offer this as a probable correction, with thanks to Miss Bradley for pointing it out--the editors.
