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**THOMAS ANDERSON OF KENT CO., DEL.  
AND THREE GENERATIONS OF HIS KNOWN DESCENDANTS**  
(continued from Vol 7 No 1)

Little is known about any of the children of James and Ann Anderson except James III (b. 1765). He married ca. 1791 Cecelia (Wright) Harriss; they both lived in Caroline Co., Md. at the time. Their children were: Mary (1792-1880) who married Peter Wright; Lydia (1794-1875); Wright b. 1796; Peter, b. 1800; James (1804-1871); Cecelia (1806-1897); and Sarah (1809-1810). (See Peter Wright and Mary Anderson, by Ernest Neall Wright, 1947)

Ezekiel, son of James Anderson, Sr. and Elizabeth, married Eliza Laws, daughter of Bolitha Laws. Ezekiel, a respected merchant and Sheriff of Kent Co., died in 1793 (KCo WB N:57). It is known that he and Eliza had at least one son, Bolitha (1780-1820); there were probably other children.

Major Anderson (d. ca. 1796), a son of James, Sr. and Elizabeth, married Sarah (?) and had at least four children, Clement (1776-1843), Ezekiel, Mary (Polly), and Susanna. Clement is buried in the Anderson Family Cemetery at Vernon in Mispillion Hundred; his wife was Sarah (1777-1836). Their children included Rebecca (1801-1832), William (1805-1875), Major, and James (1812-1873).

Ezekiel, son of Major and Sarah Anderson, was apparently a respected Justice of the Peace who lived past his 80th year and the father of Samuel Anderson (1807-1877) who married Mary A. Spence. Samuel and his wife were the parents of Susan, David, Beniah Tharp, Clementine, Mary R., Samuel and Anne. Ezekiel was also the father of Mary P. Anderson, who on 21 Jan. 1831 married Bolitha Tharp. They were the parents of William, Samuel, Beniah, Laura, Sarah Pauline, and Louisa.

A considerable amount of information is available about William Anderson, another son of James (Sr.) and Elizabeth Anderson. It comes primarily from the land and probate records of Kent Co., as William did not leave a will. The fact that his wife, Margaret Vanburkelo, has been identified helps to give a more complete picture of this family unit.

William was not likely one of the older sons of James and Elizabeth; it is suggested that his birth occurred ca. 1740. He received a bequest of 100 A when his father's will was written on 8 Apr. 1761, then proved on 13 May 1762. William had made a purchase of two tracts of land totaling about 300 A on 22 Apr. 1762, assumed to be about the time his father died (KCo DB Q-1:94). In partnership with Francis Jester he purchased 179 A in Mispillion Hd. from the heirs of Ebenezer Hawthorne in Nov. 1769 (KCo DB S-1:243). Other purchases include part of the Mt. Pleasant tract called "Increase" in Mispillion Neck from Caleb Luff in Nov. 1781 (KCo DB X-1:28), and 260 A, part of the 1000A Bridgetown tract, from Littleton Townsend in Jan. 1786 (KCo DB Y-1:130).

On 29 July 1777 William and Margaret sold the 100 A that he had inherited from his father to Thomas Rodney (KCo DB W-1:143). Subsequent sales of the other tracts were made successively over a period of years, with four sales of portions of the Bridgetown tract taking place on 15 Apr. 1786 (KCo DB Y-1:187). (It is possible that the participants in these latter transactions were Margaret's cousins and that an estate was being settled, although the deeds do not state this.)

In his detailed studies of the Nicholites, Dr. Kenneth Carroll concluded that Margaret and William were associated with the Nicholite movement, as were William's brother James and his wife Ann. (Md. Hist. Mag., vol.79, p.127) In line with the Nicholites' emphasis on the manumission of slaves, William gave freedom to John and Lydia, both in their twenties, and three children on 12 Aug. 1766. It is possible that

these slaves were brought to her marriage by Margaret, who received Lydia as part of the settlement of the estate of her father, Herman Vanburkelo, in 1748.

On 30 July 1770 Margaret and William sold to Joseph Ensor of Baltimore, Md., her share in Cecil Co., Md.'s Bohemia Manor, inherited from her great, great-grandfather, Augustine Herman (Md. Provincial Court Deeds DO5:72-76). (Ensor was the husband of one of her cousins. He gave the Andersons a nominal sum of money for Margaret's interest, apparently trying to gain a clear title to what remained of the land after 100 years.) Herman was the original patentee of the multi-thousand acre tract which encompassed Cecil Co. and part of New Castle Co., Del. He received it as a gift from a grateful Lord Baltimore for producing a highly regarded map of the eastern seaboard around the Chesapeake Bay area, and including Maryland, New Jersey, Virginia, and what is now Delaware.

The date of Margaret's death is not known, but it can be stated that it occurred after the land transactions of 15 Apr. 1786 and before what is assumed to be a second marriage for William on 31 Aug. 1791. On this date, according to the Nicholite marriage records of Caroline Co., Md., William Anderson "of Kent Co., Del." and Ann Causey were united in marriage. (The Nicholite meeting house was just across the state line and not far from where the Andersons made their home.)

If this is indeed the marriage record of our William, the groom died shortly after the wedding day. According to the Orphans' Court Records of Kent Co., Del., on 7 Sept. 1791 Ann, widow of William Anderson, signed a statement giving up "all right to the administration of the estate of William Anderson unto Reubin Anderson and Harmon Anderson Sons of said William Anderson..." On that same date Reuben and Harmon Anderson were appointed administrators of the estate. Major Anderson and Ezekiel Anderson, William's brothers, provided security of 500 pounds for the administration bond.

On Nov. 29th following, Reuben petitioned the Kent Co. Orphans Court "to appoint five Freeholders to go upon (the Wm. Anderson property) View the Lands afsd. and divide the same, if they will admit of a Division amongst the Heirs and Legal Representatives of William Anderson." The court agreed, and the following January the appointed freeholders reported to the court "that after having gone upon and viewed we are of the Opinion that the sd. real estate is not divisible either in point of situation, quantity of acres or quality, there being eight heirs and only 195 acres, a considerable part of which is marsh and cripple and chief part of the Cleared Land much worn and poor." (KCo Rec. Bk. E, folio 18) There is no record of a dowry share of the property being assigned to Ann, the widow, by the court.

On 28 Feb. 1792 the inventory of the "goods and chattles of William Anderson late of Kent Co. decd. (was) laid before us the subscribers by Reuben & Harmon Anderson Adms. of the sd. decd. this sixth day of the 10th month 1791/2. (Signed by) Robert Minors & Thomas Bowman." During the May session it was reported to the court that the real estate owned by William Anderson was judged to be worth twenty-seven shillings and six pence per acre. (KCo Rec. Bk. E, folio 19) An undated document held by the court and signed by Reuben Anderson states that he wants to buy the land of his late father and agrees to pay the amount for which it was appraised.

Two other entries in the estate records of Kent Co. should be mentioned in connection with William Anderson. The first is his service as executor of the estate of his brother-in-law, Nathaniel Killingsworth (will dat. 20 Jan. 1773, KCo WB L:126). In 1788 he was serving as guardian of John Tomlin, minor son of Covil Tomlin, dec'd., and requested that the court place a value on his ward's inheritance. (Guardians Ct. Records) On 13 Aug. 1792, after William Anderson's death, Reuben Anderson stated to the Orphans Court "that he is ready to pass an acct. of said minor's (John Tomlin's) estate." On 31 Dec. 1793, when Reuben presented an account of the estate of

William to the court, items were included for "sundries settled in John Tomlins Guardian acct." and "two accts. of Nathl. Killingsworth's Estate." (The relationship, if any, of the Tomlin family to the William Anderson family is unknown.)

The final accounting of the William Anderson estate is not dated, although it was presented to the court after Jan. 1805, when daughter Eliza married John Masten. The names of William's eight heirs are given: Gilbert, Reuben, Harmon, William, Matthias, Curtis and James Anderson, and Eliza Masten.

Putting together a biosketch of Reuben, the son of William and Margaret (Vanburkelo) Anderson, is complicated by the fact that there are at least two other men named "Reuben Anderson" who appear in the records of Kent Co. during the lifetime of "our" Reuben. Reuben, identified as the son of John Anderson, dec'd., is a participant in a land transaction of 1803. John's widow was Castilla. Another Reuben was age 61 when he appeared in the 1850 Kent Co. census.

Reuben was certainly one of the older children of William and Margaret Anderson. After he and his brother Harmon were appointed administrators of his father's estate in Sept. 1791, he alone performed most of the duties connected with that assignment. He expressed the desire to purchase the family homeplace from the other heirs in late 1792 (KCo Orphans Ct. Bk E: 23), but no deed that indicates the fate of the land has been located. In the 1800 census Reuben is grouped with the residents of Mispillion Neck; in those for 1810 and 1820, his residence is designated, simply, Mispillion Hundred.

Reuben appears to have been married more than once. His first wife was apparently Ann (Nancy) Purnell, daughter of William Purnell of Worcester Co., Md. (The Kent Co. marriage records mention that Reuben Anderson was married to Nancy Adams on 15 Nov. 1792 by Rev. Wm. McKee. Is this our Reuben?) After his marriage, Reuben petitioned the Delaware General Assembly to permit him to bring "certain Negroes" whose names were Daniel, Mingo, Leah, and Menty into Kent Co., Del. from Maryland. The petition stated "that by his intermarriage with Ann Purnall of Worcester Co., Md. he hath become entitled in law to four slaves." Permission was given in an Act of the Assembly on 9 Feb. 1796 (KCo DB E-2:197).

Reuben Anderson served as a lieutenant in the 6th Delaware Regiment in the War of 1812. (This was possibly the younger Reuben, who was age 61 when the 1850 census was recorded.) Our Reuben was almost certainly a merchant and possibly a tavern owner. Scharf states in his "History of Delaware" that Reuben Anderson built a store at Greenville in Mispillion Hundred. He is also named as one of the early postmasters. The land records of 1819 refer to Reuben Anderson, Sheriff of Kent County.

Kent Co. census records give the following information about the household of Reuben Anderson. In 1800: 2M less than 10 years of age, 3M(16-26); 1F(16-26); 5 slaves. In 1810: 2M less than 10, 1M(10-16), 2M(26-45), 1M more than 45; 1F more than 45. In 1820 there were two Reuben Anderson households in Kent County, both in Mispillion Hundred. The first is listed: 1M less than 10, 1M(10-16), 2M(16-26), 1M(26-45); 1F less than 10, 1F (16-26), 1F more than 45. The second contains: 2M less than 10, 1M(16-26), 1M(26-45); 2F(16-26).

On 6 Mar. 1817 Reuben Anderson married Mary Cade in Kent Co. Although it cannot be stated with certainty, this Reuben appears to be our Reuben. The family makeup as recorded in the 1810 census seems to imply that his first wife had died before 1810.

Reuben was involved in only a few land transactions, although there is a record of his having freed a slave, George Hill, on 11 June 1819 (KCo DB S-2:272). On 1 Sept. 1826 Reuben Anderson, "formerly merchant of Kent Co.," and wife Mary D. Anderson sold to Samuel Graham land in Mispillion Hd., Marshy Hope, which Reuben and John Graham had purchased jointly (KCo DB A-3:57).

Examination of the probate records reveals the granting of letters of administration to Charles Polk for the settlement of the estate of Reuben Anderson, Esq. on 9 Mar. 1820. A lengthy inventory of his estate was presented to the court on 13 Sept. 1820. (No mention is made of Mary Anderson, so it must be assumed that this Reuben is not Reuben, the son of William and Margaret Anderson.)

On 24 Nov. 1829, letters were granted to Mary Anderson and Samuel Graham for settling the estate of Reuben Anderson. By 1830 Mary, widow of Reuben, had married Dr. Luther Swiggert, who was named guardian of Reuben's son John and daughter Clementine. In 1832 another account mentions James Anderson, probably another son, as a legatee. Details of money "due the estate of John Purnell, etc." are given, indicating that this Reuben was married to Nancy Purnell.

Harmon Anderson, another of the older children of William and Margaret Anderson was named co-administrator with his brother Reuben of their father's estate, but as stated previously the records indicate that he did not serve in that capacity. He was probably living in Reuben's household when the 1800 census was taken. On 17 Jan. 1805 he married Elizabeth Taylor, daughter of Benjamin Taylor. He had in his household when the 1810 census was taken two children, a boy and a girl, who were less than ten years of age, two females who were between 16 and 26 and another who was more than 45 years old. Harmon's age is given as between 26 and 45. By 1820 his household had the following makeup: 2 M, less than 10; 1M(26-45); 1M more than 45; 2F less than 10; 1F(10-16); 2 F(26-45).

Harmon was deceased by Dec. 1821 when Elizabeth, his widow, signed a statement allowing William Taylor to be named as administrator of the estate. The inventory was presented to the probate court on 2 Jan. 1822.

Although census records and family information indicate that the following individual, Curtis Anderson, was the son of William and Margaret (Vanburkelo) Anderson, his placement in the family can only be tentative until confirmed. The chief stumbling block is the birth date as given in his obituary in the Dec. 24, 1857 issue of The Christian Advocate. He is said to have been born on 23 June 1778 in Frederica, Del., and to have died in Cambridge (Dorchester Co.), Md. on 1 Nov. 1857. The date of birth of an older brother, William, Jr. was recorded as 1 Oct. 1777 in the Family Bible that belonged to his son. Although it is possible, it is unlikely that the two sons of Margaret and William Anderson would have been born so close together.

Curtis Anderson was a Methodist minister, probably on a part-time basis. Scharf states in his History of Delaware that meetings of the Frederica, Del. Methodists "were first held in the home of Curtis Anderson, preaching every two weeks. The first building was erected in 1812...." Curtis was also one of the first trustees of the church.

Curtis was apparently a not-so-successful businessman. The Kent Co. Chancery Court docket lists for the Mar. 1821 session of the court a case involving Curtis Anderson and James Buckmaster and a \$1000 debt owed to Buckmaster as a result of the "copartnership of Anderson and Buckmaster."

In the 1810 census of Kent Co., Curtis Anderson's household had the following makeup: 1M(16-26), 1M(26-45); 1F less than 10, 1F(10-16), 1F(16-26), 1F(26-45). The 1820 census gives this data on his family: 2M less than 10, 1M(16-26), 1M(26-45); 2F(10-16), 1F(16-26), 1F(26-45). Curtis and his family had apparently moved to Dorchester Co., Md. before 1830.

Records of the White family of Delaware and Maryland in the Hall of Records at Dover state that Curtis Anderson (1778-1857) married Mary White, daughter of Dr. Edward White and his wife Mary. (Yet the Kent Co. marriage records state that Curtis married Mary Body on 26 Apr. 1803. Was she a widow? There is no indication in the census records that there was more than one Curtis Anderson in Kent Co. during this period.)

Although there were undoubtedly more children in Curtis' and Mary's family, the White records list only two. Thomas W. Anderson (b. 1 Sept. 1814; d. 1 Dec. 1893) married Elizabeth K. Eccleston; three children are listed in their household in the 1850 Dorchester Co., Md. census: Mary, age 11, Ellen, age 4, and W. C. age 9 months. (William C. Anderson was born 1 Oct. 1849 and died 25 Aug. 1910). Margaret B. (b. 23 Oct. 1808; d. 14 Dec. 1880), daughter of Curtis, did not marry. The 1850 census states that Thomas W. Anderson was a merchant. His father Curtis (age 72, no occupation given) and sister Margaret were living in his household at that time.

Two of the sons of William and Margaret (Vanburkelo) Anderson, William, Jr. and Mathias, were in Tennessee by 1808, possibly earlier, coming with a group of settlers from Maryland and Delaware. They were led by Adam Dale of Worcester Co., Md. who was one of the earliest settlers of the part of Smith Co., Tenn. that became Dekalb County. Later William, Jr. and Mathias bought land in White Co., Tenn. and moved their families there.

Mathias, whose wife was Mary, died in White Co. ca. Dec. 1826. His children were John, William, Curtis, Elizabeth, Thomas, Anny, and possibly Nancy, James, and Mary. He and his brother William operated a tannery in Smith Co. and apparently were involved in various business ventures together in White County.

According to the Anderson Family Bible William Anderson, Jr. was born on 1 Oct. 1777 and died 2 July 1830. He was married to Nancy, maiden name unknown, on 2 March 1807. Nancy was born on 1 Oct. 1783 and died on 12 July 1825. Their children, whose names are given in the Bible, were Eliza, Robert, James, Margaret, Mathias who married Marion Lane (1842), Mary, Reuben, and Nancy. (The writer is descended from a son of Mathias [s/o William, Jr.] and Marion [Lane] Anderson, Lee Oldham Anderson of White Co., Tennessee.)

No information has been found on Gilbert, another son of William and Margaret (Vanburkelo) Anderson. He does not appear in the census, land or probate records of Kent Co., Del. after the final settlement of William's estate ca. 1805.

Eliza, the only daughter of William and Margaret, married John Masten on 17 Jan. 1805 in Kent Co. and also disappeared from view after her father's final estate settlement was presented to the court.

The writer will be grateful for any additional information on members of the Anderson family in Kent County and most especially so for clues to the maiden names of the wives of the Anderson males. The origins of this Anderson family before Thomas made his purchase of land in Kent Co. in 1730 are also of particular interest.

The wonder is not that they did not see every Delaware reference, but that they found so many! If you believe a marriage took place in Philadelphia, but have not found it here, you would do well to consult the index at the Historical Society of Pennsylvania Library.

**OLD UNION METHODIST CHURCH CEMETERY**  
**Appoquinimink Hundred, New Castle County, Delaware**

The cemetery is located five miles below Odessa on Route 13. It surrounds an old brick church built in 1847, replacing two older buildings. The first church was built of logs in 1792 and known as "Dickinson's Chapel." By 1805 a frame church had been erected. The oldest tombstone found is that of Sarah Fields who died in 1799. Burials continue there to this day, but this listing includes only those before 1900.

We are indebted to member Carol Decker, who lives near the church and read the stones for us in 1990 and 1991. Caroline Sparks, compiler, has compared those readings with the Tatnall Tombstone Inscriptions and would welcome any corrections of dates or ages from family Bibles or genealogies.
