## REMINISCENCES OF WILMINGTON, DELAWARE, 1815-28

M. C. L. WORRELL

This article, Manuscript #376, was discovered by the editor at the University of Delaware Morris Library in 1986. It is long, handwritten, and quite difficult to unravel, all of which moved it to a back burner, behind more manageable and varied articles. But it stayed in the files, and is begun now because it is intriguing. In 1987, it was brought to our attention that a group had been working on deciphering the work. As they apparently had no plans to publish it, a copy was sent to me by an Associate Director of the Library, Bernard L. Herman, with the stipulation that their effort be cited in our presentation. Our thanks to them for making it much easier.

[ ] enclose words missing from my copy (sheared off right edge), but found in the transcript provided, and editorial comments. What follows is my interpretation, complemented by theirs; any mistakes are mine. (Mary Fallon Richards, editor)

"This envelope contains a paper description of Wilmington in the past time, in 1815 & the 20's etc., prepared by M. C. L. Worrell sometime in the [18]80's or near that date. There is also a list of the members and those who attended the meeting and of my schoolmates at the Friends School in 1817-18 etc. Also some notes of the genealogy of some of the families in which I have been in some sort connected - or at least interested tho not of our own family. Alas, they will not be appreciated by those who scarce ever heard of their existence." M. C. L. Worrell

This is an attempt at a description of Wilmington from 1815 to 26 or 28; as near as I can remember. M. C. L. W.

It is just one mile from the Christiana to the Brandywine Creek straight up Market St., which was then Main St. The Sts running East and West, were, Water - Front - 2nd - 3rd (as at present) - 4th was High St. - 5th was Queen - 6th Hanover - 7th Broad - 8th Kent - 9th Wood - Next the Kennett turnpike, now commencement of 10th St. There were no streets opened any further. The long gravel walk extending to the Brandywine Bridge commenced about that point, on the West side of Market St. No houses from there except one on the corner; of what is now 10th - and a few steps farther on, Jacob ALRICK's 3 story brick which still is standing tho built up all around. The next house is Old Sam'l CANBY's with yard in front elevated above the gravel walk, which bore to the right until it reached the Bridge which is on a line with King St. It was all open fields as far as we could see on each side of Market St. until we reached 14th St. which was then only opened a short distance west of S. CANBY's and was but a private way leading as far as his son James's residence, (now Bishop LEE's). There was a small frame house off the line just beyond Sam'l CANBY's on a triangular lot, & a few houses [between CANBY's and the bridge]. 15th was Mill St. which ran past the Mills, with the dwellings of the SHIPLEYs, POOLEs etc. on the South side as they are at present. They extended as far as French St. which perhaps was opened and could be approached from that point, but 14th St. had no entrance except from Market. No sts. opened on the West any farther than Kennett Pike. It was on the East side of Market St. above 9th all Marsh lots & green fields stretching down towards the Delaware river, where at the Mouth of the Christiana stood the Light-house, as it stands at present. A bridge spans the Brandywine at 11th St. at the old VANDEVER place, now PICKEL's foundry. The streets are now opened as far as Claymont St. near the R. Road, and from this point we can

reach now what was once Grandfather SQUIBB's on Cherry Island Marsh at the junction of Claymont St. and Vandever Avenue, the latter of which was at that time the long Marsh Lane extending from Brandywine Village, and the only way of reaching there was by crossing the bridge at Market St. & going up into the village & down the lane a mile in length. It is just as it was then with no more buildings except some few where it intersects the street where once stood the Brandywine Academy at the head which is the Phila. turnpike. There was also on the west of Market St. nothing but green fields between Kennett Pike and the Brandywine, on each side of Market. We will now leave the North end of Market and commence at the Christiana at the foot, or South. Across the bridge there were no buildings; nothing but pasture lots on each side of the Causeway, which ended at Peter JACQUET's which stood on rising ground. A road to the Southeast led to BAUDRY's powder works, he speculated in Merino sheep also, & a Merino sheep, life size carved in marble yet stands on each gate post at the entrance of his elegant mansion Eden Park. He removed to Cuba and his son-in-law E. P. GARESCHE occupied the premises as recently as 1851, when E. MONTGOMERY published her "Reminiscences of Wilmington." We will now commence at the toll house at west side of the bridge & at the foot of Market Street. Next it was the lumber yard, & west of it the Wharf. Next was the Nail factory, where I have watched the cutting off of nails from a long piece of iron which passed thro' a machine, clipping off one at a time apparently as easy as tho' it had been a piece of wood. Next was Wm. WALKER's black-smith shop and on the corner of Water St. his office - later Sam'l RUMFORD's larger wheelwright establishment, opposite our house, at the Water St. end of it. On the East side of the Bridge was Wm. WARNER's wharf where the Sloop *Fame* plied from there to Phila. Above is the Shipping Store-house just as it then was, tho' now carried on by his son Charles and Grandsons Alfred and E. Tatnall WARNER, the Wharf enlarged and the coal business carried on extensively. Joseph ROBINSON, father of J. T. the jeweler, was connected with him & I think there was a Robinson's Wharf below. Adjoining the Store-house was a long building, the "Steamboat Hotel" on southeast corner, the end facing on Water St. It has been but a short time since its removal. The proprietor was Andrew TAYLOR, father of Edward T. who was born there perhaps about 1820. In the earliest time of my remembrance, this Hotel had on its sign "Wilmington & Brandywine Coffee House."

Crossing Water St. On the northwest corner of Market & Water west side of Market was Jona' LAMBORN's Merchant Tailor, & Gent's Furnishings and following was Peter O. DANIEL tailor also - Jacob CREEMER tobacconist - John TORBERT's dwelling house - & his wholesale and retail grocery on southwest corner of Front & Market Sts.--At the East side of Market north east corner above Water was Jas. RICE's white frame, now "Holly-Tree Inn," & following were Andrew McCALL's blue frame, a tobacconist- (ancestor of all the present McCALLs) & Peter Sam'l HARKER's 3 story brick dwelling & printing establishment, of the Delaware Gazette - he was succeeded by his nephew J. Newton HARKER, at that time a boy learning the business. The next house was Richard POOLE's, shoemaker, a small yellow frame which still remained a short time since. Next on the southeast corner at Front was John HEDGE's "Seine-twine & Rope-Maker" a small green frame, which has been replaced by a 3-story brick.

Crossing Front St. - On the West side of Market at the northwest corner stood until about 1825 the Old Brick Tavern, a very antiquated looking building, which extended out over the building line on Market St. on the site where the

present one was built about that time & has since borne the name of "SHARPE's Hotel," as the descendants of Eli SHARPE the first proprietor, have always occupied it since his death. Next door above was the select dry-goods store of Ann DONALDSON, mother of Mrs. Dr. Wm. GIBBONS & Mrs. John HEDGES. The site was afterwards built on by John HEDGES a high narrow house with one kind of fancy window in each story, where they lived a long time and the daughters kept a fancy and trimming store. Then follows Alexander PORTER's, their daughters also starting a fancy store. Later Jesse SHARP kept a Hotel there. Next Wm. WALKER's, owner of the smith shop below Water St. - George JONES Watch-Maker; Theophilus JONES Shoe Store - & in the old time which I barely remember, Matthew KEAN (a public character I think) & David SMYTH's dwelling & China Store on southwest corner of 2nd & Market, that was where my mother bought my little yellow mug when I was 5 yrs. old. Jacob PUSEY, then a young (widower I think) was connected with him in some way, & the cotton carpet chain manufactured at his Auburn factory was sold there, & still continued to be after the new store was built above 3rd St. --

On the East side of Market above Front, northeast corner, was Moses MORRISON's grocery store, and above was a small old brick, the home of the two McILVAINE Maiden sisters. Then followed Isaac SOLOMON's dwelling and China Store, Jared CHESTNUT chair-maker - Captain GEDDES's - & later the Rev. E. W. GILBERT's - Dr. MONRO, John PATTERSON's (father of John C.) dwelling & Dry Goods Store, & on the southeast corner of 2nd & Market was a millinery and fancy store. The 3 houses in the center of this square were of quite an imposing appearance, with marble cornice over windows & doors and I used to stand & admire them from our Dormer window.—

Crossing 2nd St. - On the North West Corner of Market & 2nd was the Wilmington & Brandywine Bank, Daniel BYRNES Cashier, then followed McCLUNG's store, Mary BINGHAM's fancy store & Kitty Ann OCHELTREE - (the Mother of George CAPELLE,) Allen THOMPSON's Dry goods - Jos. GILPIN's Hotel. (father of Louisa PAINTER) Joseph BAILY's Druggist - Benj. SPRINGER - - Thos. C. ARICH grandfather of T. A. PORTER - John SELLERS Hatter grandfather of Dr. Frank Sellers VAUGHAN - & on the south-west corner of 3rd & Market St. was John REYNOLDS's "Iron-monger," store, with a large iron saw with the name &c, on it over the door for a sign. All the stores had the dwellings combined in those days, mostly an entrance by a side door to the latter.

On the north East corner of 10th & Market Sts. was the basin built in 1828. I think the first one for pumping up water from the Brandywine to supply the City, which had heretofore been brought from a Spring at the foot of Quaker hill on 4th St. in pipes which emptied into cisterns one at each pump. The new Courthouse now stands on the site of this basin. —

Crossing 8th St. on the North-West Cor. of 8th & Market, was at that time Gov. BENNETT's residence extending out to Shipley St. Later it was occupied by Thos. F. BAYARD, & now, it being removed, the Institute building stands on its site. I cannot recall much of these squares above 8th & 9th west side but I think they were mostly built up. Perhaps I have placed too many of the buildings below & I had forgotten some which should have been there, hence the frequent interlining. I find I have forgotten one quite important character, old Isaac KENDALL, a kind of hermit bachelor, who lived in a little one-story red frame with its gable on the St. below 8th near 7th, on the site now stands St. Pauls M. E. Church. See the Reminiscences of E. M. where I have taken some notes of his character, as well as some other notes perhaps worth referring to. On the southwest corner of 10th or near was what I remember as the "Spread Eagle tavern" with a large yard where travelling showmen exhibited their wild Animals. I

think no more buildings above, & next Kennett pike. It has already been described from there [west--?] to Brandywine. [A newspaper clipping is pictured and may or may not obscure further words here.] Clipping:

#### Removing a Landmark

##### Workmen begin the Widening of West Front Street

Workmen began yesterday afternoon to remove the south gable and side walls of the old building at the northwest corner of Front and Shipley streets for the purpose of widening West Front street at that place.

This is a historical old building, having been built by the ancestors of Washington JONES, whose father was born and lived all the 89 years of his life in it. He was a cabinet maker, and had his shop there for many years. The four-story building adjoining it on the north was afterward built and used as a cabinet shop and furniture store.

When the house that is being torn down now was built the tide water rose over nearly all the space south of Front street, and for many years afterward rose to and flowed through the gutters on Front street. William G. JONES, father of Washington JONES, used to relate how he sat on the curbstone near his father's house, with his feet in the waters of the creek.[\*]

The property belongs to L. W. PALMER. Thomas McCLARY, who owned it when the city appropriated \$1800 for the opening of West Front street, sold the property to the tenant then in possession for \$800. This purchaser then sold the property to L. W. PALMER for \$1500. He will remove the portion covering the street line and build a new gable wall, retaining the building in its present condition, except being considerable narrower on the front."

[\*] I have heard the Mother of W. G. JONES speak of herself doing so - I think he was too young for it to be.

Next comes Shipley St. No buildings below Front St. On the southwest corner of Front & Shipley stood Arthur MURPHEY's groggery, where all the lower class of drunkards were made, later it was Capt. LEONARD's office of Justice of the peace. Crossing Front, on the North-West corner of Front & Shipley was Wm. G. JONES's dwelling & Cabinet Maker establishment, above was Wm. CHANDLER's Currying do. [ditto] do. — Geo. GRIFFIN of the Lumber Yard & Jacob HADDOCK of Nail Factory below Water St. — Edw. BROOKS — and Capt. LEONARD Esq's dwelling - his widow lived there until very recently, a very old woman - she was a BUSH - above was "Neighbor MOORE's" School which I attended for a long time - next was Amelia POLK's & Wm. SOLOMON's - & on south-west corner 2nd & Shipley was Anna D. JONES's a maiden lady who kept a fancy store there ever since I remember, & very recently dec.. - On the East side above Front there were no houses except SHARPE's Stone Stable (still standing) on the Nor-east Cor. All above with the exception of a building on south east corner, were the gateways to the back yards of the houses on Market St. —

Crossing 2nd. - On the North-West Corner was a grocery store - & above a vacant space; then Alex. Also n w \***Hagar** not in former Manumission as reference above (she not being then in my Power or Possession) do as above and as freely manumitt and declare free and at her own Disposal from the Date hereof... Each to receive 100£, young ones to be taught to read the Bible. Signed 2nd day 7 mo 1777

\*The negro woman named **Hagar** mentioned not to be in the former Manumission had formerly belonged to him - and his wife for an affront in a Passion put her on board a vessel just going to Carolina for which place the vessel immediately sailed and the skipper thereof sold her and made use of the money and died leaving no Estate so that Jonathan never got one farthing of it, and had two pursuers (?) to Carolina before he could get her from the man who had her and then was obliged to give 100 S (?) beside the expense of two pursuers who then brought her back and set her free and his wife gave in a paper to the Monthly Meeting, condemning her conduct therein which was accepted as satisfactory, inasmuch as the negro was freed.
