Isaac J. Long's Book
Presented by Wm. J. Devine

The Isaac J. Long Bible pages were given to us by member Marlu Jones of Wilmington, Delaware. The Bible was given to her by her mother-in-law, Bessie Lofland Baker Jones, daughter of Isaac J. Long's daughter, Ida Blanch, who married Isaac Henry Baker. The Long family lived in Mispillion Hundred, Kent County, DE.

The two original pages of the Bible started with the birth of Ida Blanch Long in 1874. The other pages evidently were copied in from another Bible or pages by two different people. Marlu was able to tell us which writing was Mrs. Baker's. We will start the Bible with two pages that were not written into it later. We have copied the pages exactly as written.

Interested in learning more about the Isaac Long family, Doug Wenny and I looked them up in the 1850-1900 censuses. When we did not find Isaac's father, James, in the 1850 DE census, we turned to the Maryland census and found the family of James and Mary Long in Worcester County, MD. Isaac, their second child, was 9 years old, born in MD.

By the 1860 census, James Long, indexed as Jonas (sic), had moved to Dagsboro Hundred, Sussex County, DE. Mary had apparently died, as James, age 50, was listed with no wife, but with son Isaac, now 18.

In 1870, Isaac, according to the Bible record, was married to Elizabeth Dickenson. They lived in Mispillion Hundred, Kent County, DE, Harrington P.O. Living next door is Elizabeth's father, Josiah Dickerson. Although the "en" in Dickenson in the pages was very clear, we now realize it was miscopied into the Bible. Elizabeth's maiden name is Dickerson. With them in the 1870 census is Isaac J., 1 year old, and Isaac Sr.'s sister, Sarah, age 13. Isaac is a house carpenter.

By 1900, Isaac & Elizabeth have two of their children still living with them, Sallie H. 16 and Seth M. 10. They had lost five babies during the twenty years. Isaac is now a farmer and they are still living in Mispillion Hundred, Kent County, DE.

A Connecticut Girl in Delaware

On 17 March 1721, David Scott of Ridgefield, Ct., for "Love and Fatherly affection" conveyed to his beloved son James Scott "one full half of my whole right of lands in ye township of Ridgefield". On the same date, James Scott of Ridgefield, for "that Love and Brotherly affection I have and do bare toward my well beloved Sister Elizabeth Scott" of Ridgefield, conveyed 30 acres to her.

On 26 November 1726, Elizabeth Scott, alias Parker, of "ye City of New Castle" made her loving husband, Joseph Parker "of New Castle" brickmaker, attorney to sue for, recover and receive 30 acres in Ridgefield.

Then on 29 December 1726, Joseph Parker "of the Government of Philadelphia & Town & County of New Castle" for L65, sold to Benjamin Stebbins of Ridgefield 26 ½ acres "which land Came to me by my wife Elizabeth, daughter of David Scott" and on 2 January 1726/27 Joseph Parker of New Castle, "husband of Elizabeth, daughter of David Scott of Ridgefield" acquitted James Scott of further demands. (Ridgefield Deeds 2:30,32)

Bills of Passage

Robert Taylor, Passenger Agent of Philadelphia, was one of several agents used by the E. I. Dupont de Nemours Company to arrange passage for Irish workers and their families. His twenty year account from 1830 to 1850 distinguishes him as the longest engaged agent used by the Dupont Company.

The files of Robert Taylor's account contain many letters confirming the orders of passage. From his correspondence we learn the price of fares, names of the people issued tickets, the laws that governed passage of immigrants, and sometimes the individual's hometown in Ireland. One interesting fact discovered was that the Port of Philadelphia imposed a higher Emigrant Tax in 1830 compared to other ports.

African Americans from Delaware in the Union Army during the Civil War

Historical Society of Delaware

According to United State military records, 954 African Americans from Delaware fought in the Union Army during the Civil War. Although a volunteer regiment of Delaware blacks was proposed in 1863, the Delaware General Assembly never authorized it. Instead, black Delawareans joined African American regiments in other states or enlisted in the United States Colored Troops.

The Historical Society of Delaware compiled this list in the late 1990s as part of the research for a major exhibition on the Civil War. The list includes fewer than half of the Delaware blacks who served in the Union army. It was compiled from several sources, including Slave Enlistment Rolls, contemporary newspapers, muster-out rolls from the Delaware Public Archives, *Black Soldiers—Black Ink* by Thomas Truxton Moebis, and various articles on black troops in the Civil War. The list remains a work in progress, and the Historical Society of Delaware would welcome information about additional black Civil War soldiers from the First State.
