Bits & Pieces

Sussex County Criminals in the News as reported in the Adams Sentinel, Gettysburg, Pennsylvania

February 11, 1824 Kidnapping – The Delaware Gazette states that the notorious Jos. Johnson, who was so long concerned in kidnapping negroes and conveying them out of the state, was tried and convicted at the last session of the court of common pleas for the county of Sussex, and sentenced to receive thirty nine lashes on the bare back at the public whipping post, to stand in the pillory for an hour, to have his ears nailed thereto, and the soft part cut off.

June 22, 1825 We are informed by the mail-carrier from Delaware, that on Wednesday the 1st instant, a man by the name of Elisha Sharp, residing in Sussex county, Delaware, in a fit of jealousy, murdered his wife and child in a most shocking manner, by beating them with an axe helve! – he was immediately apprehended, confessed the fact, and committed to prison to await his trial. Sharp, it is said, is a sober, industrious well disposed man; and before he committed this foul deed was generally respected by his neighbours. Easton Gaz.

June 3, 1829 Patty Cannon, who was imprisoned on account of her supposed connexion with the murder of the persons who were recently discovered in Sussex county, Delaware, died in the Jail of that county on the 11th ult.

Account of Life

Written by Peter O'Daniel

The following is some account of myself written this 31st day of July 1841, and the 65th year of my age. I was born in Bedford County, Pennsylvania in the year 1776.

My father, Peter O'Daniel, and mother, who was Margaret Anderson, came to this country some years before the Revolution. They came from Ireland and landed at Philadelphia and they soon moved West. After sometime fighting the Indians, who were very troublesome, they resolved to return to the East and in the early part of my lifetime they moved into the State of Delaware.

About the 20th year of my age, I came to Wilmington, Delaware, and in that city resided near forty years.

In the year 1800 I was married to Miss Mary McLane* and there was born unto us five sons and six daughters. They were very hearty, fine and as promising children as any family could desire to be blessed with except our youngest who was weakly. This, our poor, dear daughter, died in infancy. The first born died about three years of age, were much delighted in him, perhaps too much so, particularly myself. My desire and affection was so bound up in him, it was very hard to give him up. My disappointment in his being taken from us was so great it almost broke my heart. Thus these dear children and two more of the children died when young—the remaining seven all well when last heard from. I have often thought of the goodness of the Lord in giving us this number of children, that they were all so well in body and mind, and in giving an equal number of each sex and in taking them from us, he has taken them as he gave, blessed be the name of the Lord, He takes those He gives.

No one of my father's relations ever came to this country to my knowledge. Two of mother's cousins came and went West and I have not heard from them for a long time.

While my family lived at the West in Pennsylvania, they were very much distressed with fear of the Indians, so much so that it became necessary for several families to collect together at night for safety. When one Indian was seen on the mountain alone, it was thought by the settlers that he was a spy, sent out to find some unprotected family. This would so alarm the settlement that a number of families would come together on some farm for self defense. So frequent was this gathering together at night thought necessary and so much alarmed were they, that my parents resolved to return, moving to East, where it was more thickly settled.

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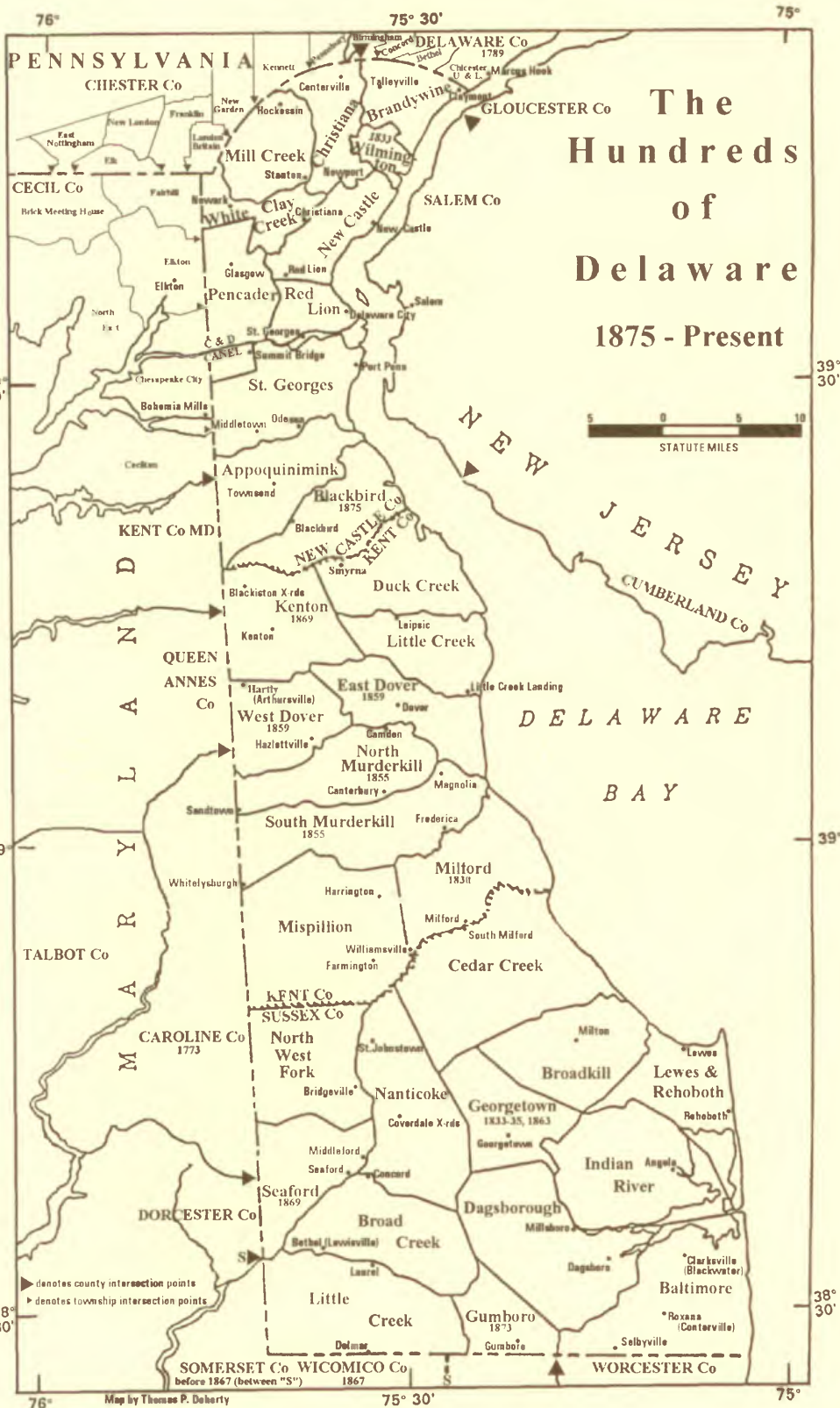
